HISTORICAL NOTE	The fourth Non-Government Organisations Forum on Women was held in Huairou, China, 30 August–8 September 1995 in conjunction with the United Nations Fourth World Conference on Women held in Beijing, 4–15 September 1995. While the Conference was where all the government sponsored delegates made the official decisions, the Forum was where the women from NGO organisations got together to workshop, exchange ideas, give talks and network across international lines. A reported 30,000 women from 181 countries attended the Forum, including hundreds of lesbians from 70 countries. The program listed a host of workshops and activities on an eclectic range of diverse topics run by groups such as the Tanzania Gender Networking Program and Amnesty International with entertainment from the Women's Circus show on a daily basis to Judy Small and Sweet Honey in the Rock in the evening. There were dozens of issue-specific tents which covered topics such as old age, lesbianism and the Asia-Pacific.
