NOTE ON COLLECTION

Spanning almost a century and a half, the collection has great significance. chronicles the history of All Saints Estate; the riverboat trade, early building construction and wine making in the Murray region. The material loosely falls into two different parts, the records pertaining to the ambitious partnership between George Smith and John Banks and those relating to G. S. Smith and Sons. Sadly the collection is fragmented and incomplete, many of the papers and ledgers were destroyed, lost or simply did not survive the ravages of exposure, neglect and time.

The first part of the collection begins in 1858 and records Smith and Banks' varied business ventures. The surviving material in this period consists of a limited range of legal documents, journals, ledgers, cash books and papers documenting wine production. There is a more consistent range of cheque book butts, receipts and bank passbooks from this period.

The partners' acquisition of land in Wahgunyah, the first and failed vineyard, the running of the sawmill and the years when Smith and Banks contracted labour are evident in the documents. Of pertinent interest is Smith and Banks' entry into the riverboat industry with the steamer 'Jane Eliza' and the barge 'Wangaratta'. building of the 'Jane Eliza', the trips, consignments, expenses, labour, legal problems and eventual sale of the vessels are recorded in the ledgers, papers and receipts. Unfortunately only a small amount of material documenting the creation of All Saints Vineyard has survived, with the exception of an early cellar sales stock book.

After John Banks' premature death in 1876, G.S. Smith the more inspired winemaker of the partners, could now dominate the direction of the vineyard. With his determined vision to create quality and internationally recognisable wines, the records are more exclusively related to All Saints. As a result, valuable information emerges about the estate, early teething problems, the buildings, expansion, staff (predominantly Chinese in the late 1800's and Italians after the 'Great War'), wine production and the financial effects incurred by phylloxera and D.B. Smith's horse racing interests.

This second part of the collection dates from the late 1800's when the business name changed to G. Sutherland Smith and later G.S. Smith and Sons. More varied records copies of outward letters enclosed in letterbooks, are evident including: correspondence, financial records, cash books, ledgers, passbooks, an abundance of cheque butts and receipts, taxation records, insurance policies, material on All Saints wine production, bottling operations, wine transfers, stock, sales and prices. From the 1950's the material is considerably more general and confined to Committee activities, bank statements, newspaper articles, periodicals and the Winery Walkabout. The financial demise of the vineyard during the 1980's is not evident.

It should also be emphasised that there is no significant personal material in the collection. As a result the female members of the Smith family and their contribution are not chronicled. This is a collection that is strictly confined to the business interests of Smith and Banks and later All Saints.

HISTORICAL NOTE

George Sutherland Smith was born in 1830 and John Banks three years later in Caithness, Scotland. They both studied at the Edinburgh Engineering Works, graduated as construction engineers and completed their apprenticeships as joiners with Banks' father. In 1853, following tales of prosperity in the goldfields, the friends emigrated to Australia.

Throughout the following decade they would utilise their considerable skills on construction projects for the Victorian and New South Wales Governments. These included building the bridge over the Edward River at Deniliquin, building part of the Gaol and Benevolent Asylum at Beechworth and constructing various churches and public buildings at Albury. Smith returned briefly to Scotland to marry John Banks' sister, Elizabeth.

1864 proved the decisive year, when the friends, recognising the potential of wine growing, acquired land on the banks of the Murray River outside Wahgunyah and planted vines. The venture did not prosper, and due to inexperience and the disastrous floods in 1867 the vineyard failed.

Seemingly oblivious to doubts, George Smith and John Banks concurrently looked further afield and decided to invest in the riverboat trade in 1865. They purchased a paddle steamer named the "Beechworth" plying it between Echuca and Albury. The steamer burned to the waterline and was rebuilt with insurance money and named "Jane Eliza".

Smith and Banks, with apparent insight, recognised that the boom of the Murray River steam trade was fading and they retired from the business. The contract to extend the railway from Seymour at the time had a profound impact on their decision. The "Jane Eliza" was contracted out and later sold in 1874. (There are discrepancies surrounding the date of the sale. Early newspaper sources cite 1867, but according to the surviving material in the collection, Smith and Banks were still operating the steamer until 1872; the cheque butts record payments to deck hands at least as late as 1873). In 1872 they acquired a sawmill and subcontracted for the supply of sleepers to the Victorian Government.

The partners made a second and more cautious attempt in the wine industry in 1869. George S. Smith would prove the driving force in the successful venture. Selecting land three miles from Wahgunyah, 100/150 acres were planted with carefully chosen vine stocks and a small pisé (mud) cellar was constructed for wine processing. The property was named ALL SAINTS after a parish in Caithness and was for many years the most extensive vineyard in the Murray district. The field hands, labourers and pickers were predominantly Chinese workers from the goldfields.

HISTORICAL NOTE

G.S. Smith's wife, Elizabeth, died in 1871 and his partner, John Banks, in 1876. The date of Banks' retirement from the vineyard is unknown but it is evident that he was less involved by the early 1870's. Banks' widow was financially supported by George Smith until her death in 1895.

All Saints quickly gained international recognition when their first wine produced won a gold medal in the Vienna Exhibition in 1873. G.S. Smith was the first Australian winemaker to win at a world exhibition. This honour was followed by a silver medal at the Philadelphia Exhibition and gold medals in Paris in 1878, Melbourne in 1880 and Calcutta in 1882.

Due to this success the vineyard was extended and renovated to accommodate the demand. The building of the brick cellar modelled on the Castle of Mey near Caithness commenced in the late 1870's. (According to legend, G.S. Smith's father worked as a builder on the original castle). The vats were built by a German who had come to Australia to work for Benno Seppelt. The cellar was finally completed in 1880 with 70-foot long oregon beams and oak imported from America by sailing ships, and transferred from Melbourne to Wahgunyah by bullock wagons. All Saints was considered to have the largest oak wine storage in Australia, for just under a million gallons of wine.

The marketing arm of the Vineyard, located in the Selborne Chambers in Melbourne, was established by G.S. Smith's eldest son, Joseph, in 1881.

It was David Banks Smith (1864-1937) who succeeded his father at Wahgunyah in 1890 and remained in control of All Saints. A prominent and popular figure, D.B. Smith's contribution cannot be overestimated and he is universally recognised as having played the central role in establishing the vineyard's enduring reputation. Smith also invested in his other passion, horse racing, and in 1890 he established a racing stable. In 1886, he married Daisy Morris of the Morris wine family.

The remaining son, George Joseph Banks Smith's aptitude for languages was duly exploited and he became the "commercial traveller".

George Sutherland Smith died in 1906 and was spared the full tragedy that struck the Victorian wine industry throughout the decade. Phylloxera, which attacks the root structure of the vines, destroyed most of the vineyards in the state. All Saints was one of the surviving wineries and was replanted with resistant grafted vines in 1912; many of the smaller growers returned to less precarious agricultural pursuits. By 1922 All Saints had grown to 1100 acres with 300 to 400 acres of new vines established.

Inevitably, the scale of wine production in the area was dramatically reduced with the ravages of Phylloxera, economic depression and the difficult market conditions which prevailed in Australia and overseas. For All Saints, the latter events had little impact and with D.B. Smiths' talent and the avoidance of problematic family succession, the estate thrived. After D.B. Smiths' death in 1937, his sons David S. Smith (b.1898) and George S. Smith (b.1899) took over management. The cellars were extended, storage capacity increased by 15000 gallons, and a laboratory was added. Under G.S. Smiths' helm, an expert was brought over from South Australia to make wine under more scientific conditions.

The 1950's were kind to wine production in the Rutherglen area and the industry was rejuvenated. All Saints responded to the growing demand and installed an extensive irrigation system. By 1967, the dynastic tradition of All Saints prevailed with the fourth generation of male Smith family members represented by G.S. Smith's great- grandsons Ian, George and Peter. The business continued in the ownership of the Sutherland Smith family for well over 100 years, before being acquired by an investment syndicate in the late 1980s. The sudden death of the CEO of the syndicate led to the appointment of a receiver, and the sale of considerable quantities of the large stocks of old fortified wines, leading to the (incorrect) belief at the time that all the best aged wines had been sold. LISTED BY Fay Anderson In 1991 Brown Brothers acquired All Saints and set about June 1994 DATE restoring all aspects of the business. A few years later, and as part of an amicable rearrangement of the Brown Brothers family interests, Peter R Brown sold his share in Brown Brothers and acquired All Saints Estate (and St Leonards Vineyard) from the family. In November 2005, his three children (the fourth generation of the Brown family) – Eliza, Angela and Nicholas –

took over management.
