HISTORICAL NOTE:	<p>Norman Macgeorge was born in Adelaide on 8 July 1872, the son of a prosperous draper. He studied art at the Adelaide School of Design and the National Gallery School in Melbourne and then taught drawing at Wesley College, 1902-1906, the Melbourne Teachers' College and Melbourne Church of England Grammar, 1902-32. He married May Ina Hepburn on 25 Jan 1911, the granddaughter of pioneering pastoralist, Capt. John Hepburn. In the same year, the Macgeorges engaged Harold Desbrowe Annear to design them a house at the junction of the Yarra River and Darebin Creek, Ivanhoe. They lived in the house for the rest of their lives and the location provided the scenery for many of Norman's paintings.</p> <p>Macgeorge painted lyrical landscapes but was also interested in the modern art movements of Europe. He was active in art education and gave regular lectures at the National Gallery and to university extension classes, wrote art reviews for the Melbourne <i>Herald</i>, exhibited his works and, in 1938, helped establish the Contemporary Art Society. He published two works, <i>The Borovansky Ballet in Australia and New Zealand</i> (1946) and <i>The arts in Australia</i> (1948). He died on 2 Sept 1952. May Macgeorge died in 1970.</p>

		<i>Note:</i> The series covers diaries, address and notebooks. The diaries are commercially produced ones; variously in A4, A3, and sizes in between, and pocket diary sizes. The layout is usually of the 3 or 4 entries per page format. The diaries vary in content length from having detailed entries, as for example when the author was overseas, to being little more than appointment diaries and only listing engagements. They record events and activities rather than thoughts and reflections. While some of the entries are in ink, most are in faint and faded pencil and close to illegible.
