HISTORICAL NOTE	John Malcolm Fraser was born in Toorak, Melbourne on 21 May 1930. His grandfather, Sir Simon Fraser (1832–1919), had emigrated from Canada in 1853, initially to work as a prospector, but later moving into business, farming and politics. He was elected to the Victorian Legislative Assembly in 1874 and later served as a delegate to the Australasian Federal Convention (1897–1898) and a senator representing the Free Trade Party (1901–1913).	
	Malcolm's father, John Neville Fraser (1890–1962), studied law at the University of Oxford, but on his return to Australia concerned himself largely with his work as a pastoralist. In 1926, he married Una Woolf. Neville and Una had two children: Lorraine (1926–) and (John) Malcolm (1930–). The Fraser family lived at Balpool-Nyang near Moulamein in New South Wales before moving to 'Nareen', a station in western Victoria, in 1943. During this period Malcolm attended Tudor House School in New South Wales (1940–1943) and Melbourne Grammar (1944–1948). In 1949, he was admitted to the University of Oxford to study 'Modern Greats' (Politics, Philosophy and Economics).	
	After graduating, Malcolm Fraser returned to Victoria and decided to embark on a political career. He succeeded in being elected as Liberal member for the seat of Wannon in western Victoria at his second attempt in 1955. A backbencher under Menzies for ten years, Fraser gained his first cabinet post as Minister for the Army under Prime Minister Harold Holt in 1966. He went on to become Minister for Education and Science (1968–1969 and 1971–1972) and Minister for Defence (1969–1971). Following the Labor government's election win in 1972, he served as Shadow Minister for Industrial Relations. He became leader of the Liberal Party in March 1975 and in November became caretaker Prime Minster after the Governor-General, Sir John Kerr, dismissed the Whitlam	

	government. He was returned to office through election victories in 1975, 1977 and 1980, before losing to Bob Hawke at the 1983 election. He resigned from politics in March 1983. Following his formal political career, Malcolm Fraser has continued a presence on the world stage, as Chair of the United Nations Panel of Eminent Persons on the Role of Transnational Corporations in South Africa (1985); as Co-Chair of the Commonwealth Group of Eminent Persons campaigning for an end to apartheid in South Africa (1985–1986); and Chair of the UN Secretary-General's Expert Group on African Commodity Issues (1989–1990). In 1987 he founded CARE Australia, the country's largest non-political and non-religious overseas aid organisation and was president of CARE International from 1990 to 1995. In 1997, he led a Commonwealth Observer Mission to Pakistan to monitor the national elections. Malcolm Fraser remains actively interested in issues associated with
	human rights, multiculturalism and reconciliation with indigenous Australians. He has been highly critical of the Howard government's involvement in the war in Iraq, as well as of its treatment of asylum seekers.

DESCRIPTION	This series includes correspondence and published material on various subjects and was maintained by J M (Malcolm) Fraser or, on his behalf, by his staff (especially his Press Secretary). The files relate mainly to the period Fraser was a member of the Opposition during the Whitlam Labor Government (1972–75), but prior to his becoming Leader of the Opposition in March 1975. In this period he was Opposition spokesman firstly on primary industry and, later, on labour and immigration. Some files in the series, however, concern an earlier period when he was Minister for Education and Science in the McMahon Liberal-Coalition Government (1971–72).
	Many files in the series are concerned with the development of Liberal Party policy in the early 1970s. Other subjects covered include abortion, Australian Labor Party policies and senior ALP figures (e.g. Lance Barnard, Dr Jim Cairns, Clyde Cameron, Al Grassby, E G (Gough) Whitlam, Ken Wriedt), Australian Security Intelligence Organisation, budgets, economy, Schools Commission, the 1972, 1974 and 1975 elections, electoral redistribution, employment, foreign affairs, industrial relations, legislation (e.g. <i>Trade Practices Bill</i> 1973, <i>Family Law Bill</i>

	1974), manufacturing industry, Mr Fraser's overseas visit to South East Asia, London and Canada in mid 1973 and the wool industry.
	The series includes copies of correspondence with political colleagues and acquaintances, speeches and speech notes, reports, news cuttings, press releases, transcripts of media interviews, <i>Hansard</i> extracts, Liberal Party papers, Parliamentary Legislative Research Service papers, publications and other background material, some dating from the 1960s. Several files have 'Cabinet Office' file covers, perhaps obtained by Mr Fraser's staff in an office cleanup at the end of his term as Prime Minister in early 1983.
