Zelda D'Aprano was born in Carlton, Melbourne, in 1928 of Jewish working-class immigrant parents, and her early life was a constant battle against poverty, ignorance and discrimination. She left school at

14, married at 16 and soon after gave birth to a daughter.

Subsequently, D'Aprano worked and qualified as a dental nurse at Larundel Hospital and became female shop steward for female staff for the Hospital Employees' Union No.2 Branch. She left Larundel after

15 years.

She was employed in the Meat Industry Employees' Union office

when the union was involved in the 1969 Equal Pay case.

It was her experience in the workforce, trade unions and left-wing politics which helped to define D'Aprano's political activism. This

culminated in her most famous act – chaining herself to the Commonwealth Building in October 1969 in protest at women's unequal pay. A prominent feminist, D'Aprano's career and life were related in her autobiography, 'Zelda: the becoming of a woman'
