<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>In 1955 Haldane-Stevenson resigned as senior Chaplain at Larkhill Artillery School, Wales, on a matter of principle. He migrated to Western Australia where he served as Anglican minister at Wogan Hills. He transferred to St Silas' Anglican Church, North Balwyn. He was actively involved with defending the right of a cleric to re-marry after divorce. He contributed to campaigns for immigration reform and world peace. Rev Stevenson changed his name to Haldane-Stevenson. He lodged claim for a defunct barony which he lost.</p>

The communion set is hallmarked London, [maker's mark] P.D. over W. and is dated [Chalice and Paten – 1913; Spoon and Host Box – 1914] The box is lockable, leather covered, velvet lined and embossed "Rev. A.H. Stevens". Unrelated to, but included in the box is a presentation silver gavel with ivory handle, with Masonic Lodge engraved inscription [unmarked, 19C].	1913-1914
