HISTORICAL NOTE	George Harrison emigrated to Australia from Yorkshire in 1861, finding employment as a farm labourer and later as Shire valuer for Camperdown. He took up a selection at Mt. Porndon in the Western District in the 1880s.  "Ted" (Edward Todd) Harrison, driver in the 4 <sup>th</sup> Light Horse, 8 <sup>th</sup> reinforcement, wrote semi-regular letters to his sisters at home while he was on active service. Correspondence from Ted, as well as letters from his brother James (Captain, ANZAC Cycle Corps), continued up to his death, in action, on July 14, 1918.  Herbert Price, a member of the Harrison Family was a machinist who became a prosperous businessman. He invested in various areas, including timber, olive oil and a dairy.
