HISTORICAL NOTE: The International Bookshop was established by the Communist Party of Australia (CPA) in 1933 at 182 Exhibition Street, Melbourne. It was initially called the Modern Bookshop, but the name had changed to International Bookshop by 1934. When the Menzies Government declared the CPA an illegal organisation in 1940, the shop was not closed down as it was not owned legally by the Party - however, it did not escape police attention over the years.

Around 1940, the International Bookshop moved next door to 180 Exhibition Street. It moved to 57 Little Bourke Street in 1957, then to the second floor of Excelsior House, 17 Elizabeth Street in 1960, where it remained until 1993. A second-hand department opened on the sixth floor in 1970.

George Ireland was the first manager of the International Bookshop. Jack Morrison took over the management in 1938 on George Ireland's recommendation. After Jack Morrison's retirement, Kath Gleeson became manager in 1970, followed by David Hudson in 1973.

The International Bookshop also established the Red Bookshop in Princes Gate Arcade in 1971 and the Ten Days Bookshop in Lonsdale Street in 1976. Other related shops included the Real World Bookshop in Geelong (1977-78) and a shop at CPA offices in Exploration Lane, Melbourne.

The International Bookshop was one of the most successful bookshops associated with the CPA. Closure in 1993 was partly due to problems of access for customers during renovations of the Elizabeth Street building in which the shop was a tenant. There are currently plans to re-establish an International Bookshop.

NOTE ON COLLECTION: This collection contains a variety of documents relating to the

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operation of the International Bookshop from its beginnings in the 1930s up to 1992, including records of premises and staff and dealings with book suppliers, customers and other bookshops.

After transfer of this material to the University of Melbourne Archives, loose letters and papers not already housed in relevant files were placed into file covers at the Archives and, with some exceptions, file titles have been added by the Archives in order to make the collection more accessible.

		This series contains lists of publications available at the International Bookshop, including regular lists covering a range of stock and occasional special lists of particular kinds of publications. The Bookshop began mailing out regular lists and notes on recommended reading and recent publications in September 1969. This regular newsletter went under various names, principally <i>News Bulletin</i> and <i>Booknews</i> (or <i>Book News</i>). No evidence has been found that newsletters as comprehensive as these were compiled by the Bookshop before 1969. However, file 12/1 includes two 1968 circulars drawing the attention of customers to specific publications.
		This series also contains booklists and catalogues collected by the International Bookshop from other booksellers and publishers in Australia and overseas, and periodicals containing information about relevant publications. It also includes some miscellaneous notices, advertisements, reference material and correspondence.

The invoices are in rough chronological order by date of receipt of the goods. Many of the invoices are grouped under the corresponding customs forms which list the countries of origin and other summary information concerning publications received over a period of one or more months. Handwritten headings may appear on the invoices which correspond to the classifications used on the customs forms, e.g. hardcover, paperbound, periodicals.
		This series also includes occasional correspondence from overseas regarding orders, accounts, subscription renewal, etc., and correspondence from the Australian Customs Service regarding the preparation of customs entry forms.

6 18 Invoice Books (Schools), 1981 - 1986

This is a series of numbered books comprising copies retained by the International Bookshop of invoices issued to customers. These invoices chiefly record sales to schools, including secondary schools, colleges of Technical and Further Education, etc. In addition, the books contain some invoices that were issued to other bodies and to individual customers - it is unclear whether or not all these

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		purchases were made for schools. Some sales to schools were recorded in the miscellaneous invoice books (Series 19). Fred Lester commenced selling books to secondary schools on behalf of the International Bookshop in 1963, a service which was continued after his retirement (<i>Melbourne's Radical Bookshops</i>, pp. 120-21).
