KENDALL, William Tyson and Ernest Arthur Accessions 73/75, 78/36, 80/40, 83/148

HISTORICAL NOTE:

William Tyson Kendall, founder and Principal of the Melbourne Veterinary College, was born in the English Lake District in 1851, and after qualifying as a veterinary surgeon in London returned there to practise. In 1880 he arrived in Melbourne, where he was instrumental in the formation of a Veterinary Association that year. In 1887, as secretary of the Veterinary Association, he drafted the Veterinary Surgeons' Bill which was passed by the Victorian Parliament after slight modification. Kendall opened the Melbourne Veterinary College in Brunswick Street, Fitzroy in 1888. In 1908-1909, when the Veterinary School opened at the University of Melbourne, he transferred students from his College and joined the staff of the new School. He lectured in subjects including Veterinary Medicine, Obstetrics and Therapeutics and gave clinical instruction, remaining at the University until his retirement in c.1918. Kendall was married twice. With his first wife he had a family of five surviving sons and one daughter. He died on 11 August 1936.

Ernest Arthur Kendall, born August 1876, was the oldest of six children of W.T. Kendall and one of four sons who became veterinary surgeons. He lectured at both the Melbourne Veterinary College and the University Veterinary School between 1897 and 1910. He served in a veterinary capacity in the Boer War and again in World War I, during which he was promoted to Colonel. He became Chief Veterinary Officer of the Victorian Department of Agriculture, and in the 1930s he was appointed chairman of the Milk Board. He died aged 61.

NOTE ON COLLECTION:

This collection comprises records transferred at different times over a number of years. The records include correspondence, papers, reports, speeches, reminiscences, newspaper cuttings and photographs. The transfers were arranged through Norah Killop, granddaughter of Kendall. The majority of the records were transferred at one time, but some individual items were transferred separately later, such as a volume of historic newspaper cuttings from J.C. Le Souef in 1978 and two exercise books containing handwritten reminiscences by W.T. Kendall transferred in 1980 (and typed afterwards). Related items added to the original documents in this collection include a book of recipes and historical asides (containing information about the Kendall family and veterinary history) received from Margaret Slatter in 1983, and the transcript of an interview with D.H. Le Souef.

The various accessions have been amalgamated and listed as one collection, arranged into: records primarily relating to W.T. Kendall; records primarily relating to E.A. Kendall; photographs; related records of recent date. [73/75, 78/36, 80/40, 83/148]

- To W.T. Kendall, 30 March 1909, expressing gratitude for his work in veterinary education and asking if he would sit for a portrait to be hung in the newly established Veterinary School at the University of Melbourne. Handwritten (may be a copy).
 - Letter of introduction for W.T. Kendall, to be taken on his visit to Europe, signed by Premier of Victoria, 1 November 1909.
 - To ?W.T. Kendall from a farmer asking questions about cows, June 1918 (with notes ?by Kendall) on the back of the letter.

- 27 P.A. Kendall, Repatriation and Demobilisation Department, A.I.F., London, to Professor H.A. Woodruff, Veterinary School, University of Melbourne, 14 July 1919, concerning training for men awaiting repatriation to Australia. 4 pp.
- 28 ?E.A. Kendall, Veterinary Association of Victoria (Department of Agriculture, Melbourne), to Lt. Col. M. Henry, Veterinary Association of New South Wales, 9 April 1920, concerning financing and writing of book on veterinary history, Australian Army Veterinary Corps records and history, and the question of forming an Australian Association.

Correspondence to E.A. Kendall and related family letters

This collection includes correspondence addressed to E.A. Kendall, to Colonel (probably E.A.) Kendall, and to Mr Kendall (probably one of E.A. Kendall's brothers). Many of the letters concern the Kendall Oration or Lecture.

- Leonard Pearson, Department of Veterinary Medicine, University of Pennsylvania to E.A. Kendall on R.M.S. *Miowera*, Vancouver, 25 February 1902, replying to his inquiry about the Department, 3 pp.
- 30 8 October 1931, Colin MacKenzie, Australian Institute of Anatomy, Canberra, to Colonel Kendall, inquiring about Kendall Lecture, photograph of W.T. Kendall not yet received, and Kendall Medal; and copy of letter from Director-General of Health to Colin MacKenzie, 30 September, re Commonwealth Government bonds not yet received (in connection with the Kendall Lecture).
- 19 November 1931, Colin MacKenzie to Mr Kendall (one of sons of W.T. Kendall), wishing to know family's intentions re Kendall Lecture, as has not yet heard from Colonel Kendall. A minimum of 150 pounds 'will establish this Lecture in perpetuity to be delivered every two years'.
- 2 32 7 December 1931, to Ern (E.A. Kendall) from his brother Elvie in Maffra, replying to request for financial help (?re Kendall Lecture).

Offers 100 pounds (and refers to Alice's promise ?to pay for the medal). Also contains family news. 2 sheets.

- 33 14 December 1931, Colin MacKenzie to Colonel Kendall. Is glad to know Kendall Lecture is not to be allowed to lapse. The first lecture settled that W.T. Kendall was the founder of veterinary science in Australia. Would like photograph from which to make an enlargement and will also have a face mask modelled in clay for casting, the result to be placed in the Northern ?or Applied Anatomy Museum. Would prefer to have a definite date to give Treasury for the handing over of the bonds. Concludes with tentative proposals for the second Kendall Lecture.
- 15 December 1931, to Ern (E.A. Kendall) from his brother Elvie in Maffra, sending cheque for 100 pounds, and mentioning family news including forthcoming birth of another child. 2 sheets.
- 22 March 1933, to E.A. Kendall from ?A/Director-General of Health, re Dr H.R. Seddon's appointment as next Kendall lecturer, and thanking him for photograph of W.T. Kendall.
- 4 August 1933, Invoice from A.H. Wittenbach & Co., Richmond to Mr Kendall in connection with Kendall medal.
- 4 August 1933, Account/Receipt from A.H. Wittenbach & Co., Richmond to Mr Kendall (related to invoice above).
- 21 August 1933, to Colonel Kendall from Colin MacKenzie, regretting Colonel Kendall's inability to visit Canberra for Congress and Kendall Lecture, and outlining arrangements for display of face mask of W.T. Kendall and reception to be held by Lady MacKenzie.

Tape returned to N. Killop. 5 pp.
 - Recipes, Remedies and Relics, compiled by Margaret Slatter, published by the Auxiliary to the Australian Veterinary Association, New South Wales, 1983. Published to celebrate the occasion of the XXII World Veterinary Congress held in Perth in August 1983 and the 34th anniversary of the International Women's Auxiliary (formed to promote friendship among veterinary families around the world), this is a book of recipes interspersed with historic photographs and information about Australian veterinary history, veterinary surgeons and veterinary families.
