GENERAL NOTE:

Later, the firm became Hepburn, Leonard and Rowe, Hepburn, Leonard & Rugg (at Warrnambool), Hepburn & Rowe, B. Hapburn & Co., Hepburn, Dowling & Co., and Hepburn, Dowling & Crawford.

DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS.

1. The first part of the letterbook (pp.1-388) contains correspondence conducted by Turner in his capacity as agent for Hepburn and Leonard. Most of these letters take the form of reports to the head office in Ballarat and refer to details of possible and actual transactions concerning stock and stations. Descriptions of various properties are given including Grassdale, Glenaulin, Eumeralla East and Eumeralla West.
