HISTORICAL NOTE	After studying in Melbourne and Edinburgh, and practising in Port Moresby, Wallace established gynaecological and general practices in Melbourne in 1927. His consuming medical interests were birth control and drug addiction and he lectured and published on family planning, marriage guidance, eugenics, and world peace, disarmament and government.

GENERAL NOTE:

Victor Hugo Wallace (1893-1977) was born at Boorahman, Northern Victoria, where his father was the State School teacher. He graduated M.B.B.S. in 1918 M.D. (Melbourne) in 1920, and was admitted F.R.C.S. (from Edinburgh) in 1924. He returned to Melbourne in 1926, but soon went to Port Moresby as the relieving Government Medical Officer. In 1927, he leased a practice in Charlton, and in 1928 his final move began: in May of that year, he purchased land in Hughesdale, and practised in rented premises while his large house-cum-surgery was built. He practised as a G.P. at the corner of Poath and Neerim Roads from 1928 till his death in 1977. He also practised as a gynaecologist at 'Lister House', 61 Collins Street, from c.1937 to the late 60s. His special medical interests included contraception and vasectomy, and drug addiction. These interests extended into social issues such as family planning, marriage guidance and sex education, population policy and control, eugenics, world peace and disarmament, and World Government; he lectured and published extensively on these issues. These medical and social issues are well covered in the present collection, and are also canvassed briefly in his autobiographical The Wallace Story (Melbourne, n.d. (1973) - see 14/4).

The collection has been processed and listed in the form in which its originator arranged the material.
