Of the five new Chairs sought by the Faculty of Economics and Commerce, this was regarded as having the highest priority because the subject was a basic one "in the Commerce course and in the School of Economics (Arts Degree with Honours)" as well as being an optional subject for the B.A. (Ordinary Degree). When in 1955 La Nauze was appointed Ernest Scott Professor of History, he was replaced by Wm. Woodruff. On Woodruff's retirement G.N. Blainey was appointed Professor.
