HISTORICAL NOTE	Born in England in 1850, Nanson entered Trinity College in 1870 and as second wrangler and second Smith's prizeman, he became a fellow of Trinity College in 1874. In the same year he was appointed Professor of Applied Mathematics at the Royal Indian Engineering College, Surrey. After W.P. Wilson died, Nanson was appointed Professor of Mathematics at the University of Melbourne in 1875. Widely known as an electoral reformer, he advocated proportional representation and preferential voting and published a series of pamphlets on the subject. Nanson had a life-appointment but negotiated a pension settlement with the University and retired as Emeritus Professor in 1922.

Containing menus, information concerning relations with servants, making of wills, notification of births and deaths, and many other matters, with pages for keeping accounts under a comprehensive list of headings. 1873.

Keeping of accounts commences July 1875.

On first page after advertisements etc. "Total Expenditure June 28 - Dec. 31 1875", showing itemised totals.

Inscribed on title page "E.M. Nanson". Other volumes are either similarly inscribed, or simply initialled "E.H.J."

1. 1873 (commenced June 1975) Inscribed on title-page, "E.H. Nanson".
This contains advertisements, a list of Lett's publications for domestic use, an almanac, ready reckoner, wages table, table of values of foreign money in English currency, weights and measures, obligations of mistresses and servants, rates and taxes, table showing in which month various foods are in season etc., "Seasonable dinners for every week in the year" and the flowers available in each month, requirements in relation to births and vaccination, deaths, unclaimed property and marriages.

Space is allowed for engagement and dismissal of servants, receipts for servants' wages, classified items, condensed cellar book, etc. The chief of the book consists of pages ruled for daily entries of amounts paid to tradesmen (baker, cheesemonger, grocer etc.) or for classes of items (glass, china etc., stable expenses etc.) to which Mrs. additions have been made as required. On the first page after the advertisements etc. is noted

"Total expenditure June 28 - Dec 21 1875".

Thereafter the pages are ruled and entries made as before.

3. 1877 Lett's Housekeeper Enlarged and Engagement Book, with published information as in 1876, together with Australasian Postal Rates, costs of money orders, Passports (where desirable and where necessary), The New Lectionary, Weights and Measures, Calendar for 56 years, Wages Table.

In addition to the pages ruled for daily expenditure and the Annual Balance are pages ruled for a Summary 1877 under the headings of tradesman or items.

4. 1878. Information provided includes commercial stamp duties. Entries commence 18 February.

5. 1881. Information provided includes The Language of Flowers, Alimentary Tables, Abbreviations and their Meanings, Letts's Time-Saving Manufactures. Space if allowed at the foot of accounts pages for memoranda, which are generally used, (less frequently in subsequent years) recording letters received and sent, visiting etc.
6. 1882. Pages containing entries for the first time: Household Gas Register and Memoranda of things lent, etc.
