HISTORICAL NOTE	<p>Gwenda Lloyd (nee Kent Hughes) was born in 1900 and educated at Melbourne Church of England Girls' Grammar School and the University of Melbourne graduating B.A. in 1922 and Dip. Ed in 1923. After travelling overseas Mrs Lloyd returned in 1924 and accepted a teaching appointment at C.E.G.G.S., her old school, where except for a brief period in the 1930s she was to remain until her retirement in 1956. She was invited by the Headmistress, Miss D.J. Ross, who she was closely associated with in policy development, to return in 1940 to assist in the establishment of a non-academic course at the school. Miss Ross' attempts to foster a measure of self-government and self-discipline among the girls. Mrs Lloyd also lectured in the history of education and current affairs at Mercer House, Malvern and at the Kindergarten Training College, Kew, and was interested in the latest development in educational theory and practice.</p>
