#### HISTORICAL NOTE:

The Communist Party of Australia formed in 1920 (as the Australian Communist Party or ACP). During the 1930s depression its membership increased as people sought alternatives to industrial capitalism. It reached the peak of its influence post WWII, when its membership was at its largest, and a number of its members held key trade union positions. Several prominent academics have also featured amongst its members. In 1949 the Menzies government conducted a Royal Commission into the CPA, and in 1950 a national referendum to outlaw the CPA was defeated. In 1963 the Party split over the Sino-Soviet issue, and a splinter CPA (Marxist-Leninist) was formed. In 1970 and 1984 there were other ideological splits, all of which worked to weaken the Party. The CPA officially disbanded in 1989. #### NOTE ON THE COLLECTION:

This list consolidates material received between the years 1976 and 1990. A further large accession of material was received in 1991 following the disbanding of the Party and the closing of the Office in Smith Street Collingwood. The 1991 Accession is listed separately.

The material in this first consolidated collection consists overwhelmingly of published and printed material produced by the CPA or, in smaller quantity, collected by the CPA. There is very little manuscript material in the collection. Many of the early records of the CPA Victorian State Committee were destroyed during periods of illegality. The records of the Central Committee are more complete and held in the Mitchell Library in Sydney.

This list represents several accessions of CPA material from 1976 and the 1980s from the office and individual members. There is some indication in an early accession that the Party had an organised filing system, of which little remained. The files in this listing are therefore arranged according to activities of the Party (e.g. CPA Organisation, Elections), type of record (Constitutions, Publications) and subject (Aborigines, Equal Pay) with the degree to which this order is original noted in the Series description.
