HISTORICAL NOTE	<p>Ray Jones was a signaller in the 19th Battalion of the AIF. Prior to the outbreak of war, Jones was employed by Anthony Hordern & Sons, Universal Providers. He enlisted on 17 February 1915, aged 25, and sailed from Sydney on board the "SS Ceramic" on 25 June 1915. Jones saw service in Egypt, Gallipoli, France and Belgium before being assigned to permanent base work because of an ear problem in July 1917. He saw out the war in France and then returned to England where he met and married an English woman named Edie. Jones finally returned to Australia late in 1919. He corresponded regularly with his family in NSW and his sister who was a missionary in China from 1915 to 1919. Throughout the war, he sent home souvenirs many of which are contained in this collection with a significant proportion of correspondence between him and his family during his wartime service overseas.</p>

GENERAL NOTE: Ray Jones was a signaller in the 19th Battalion of the A.I.F. He was the only son amongst the five children of Mr and Mrs Jones of "Cosy Camp", Penshurst, N.S.W. He appears to have been rather a fanatical collector and whilst away at war he sent home all sorts of souvenirs from the Front. The collection includes letters, diaries, war journals, pamphlets, programmes, newspaper clippings, photographs and objects.

Prior to the outbreak of war Jones was employed by "Anthony Hordern & Sons, Universal Providers, New Palace Emporium, Brickfield Hill". He enlisted on 17 February 1915, aged 25, and sailed from Sydney on board the "S.S. Ceramic" on 25 June 1915. Arriving first at the Suez Canal, Jones later saw service in Egypt, Gallipoli, France and Belgium before being assigned to permanent base work because of an ear problem in July 1917. He saw out the war in France and then returned to England where he met and married an English girl named Edie. Jones finally returned to Australia late in 1919.

Throughout his absence Jones maintained a regular correspondence with his family. The surviving letters contained in this collection (a total of 428 to and from Jones) document the war time experiences of a family, as well as individuals in a variety of contexts. Ray Jones's own letters describe the harsh conditions and monotony of trench warfare. They also contain comments on issues such as the conscription debates, the behaviour of the recruits, and descriptions of the armistice celebrations. The letters from Jones's family describe the situation at home. He received weekly letters from either his father or mother and less regularly from his sisters Annie, Daisy, Ena (Kiddie) and Dorrie (Dorothy). Daisy was a trainee nurse at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital in Sydney during the war, whilst Ena and Dorrie were both still at school (they were aged 8 and 14 respectively when Ray left).

An interesting addition to the collection is the material concerning Annie Jones. Annie was a missionary in China during the years 1915 to 1919. In her letters to Ray and her diary of a holiday trip to West China, Annie describes the customs, culture, and political climate in China during the war years. Some of the letters from China are signed Annie and some Nancy but the handwriting appears to be the same. As Mr and Mrs Jones refer to their daughter Annie it is possible Nancy was a middle or nick-name she used.

Outward:

Letters from Ray Jones to his family in Australia. A total of 192 of Jones's letters from 18 July 1915 to 10 June 1919 have survived. The original letters are contained in two bound volumes and typescripts of the letters have been made. Jones numbered every letter he sent so his family would know if any mail went missing. This did happen and the letters he numbered 16, 18, 22, 73, 87, 88, 144, 169, 178 were noted by the family when the collection was acquired, as never having been received. Also Jones often included letters to his sisters within the letters he sent to his parents, and only numbered the latter. Thus to establish the order of each letter amongst the total body of surviving letters it was necessary to give each a new number. Therefore each letter has a number given to it by Ray, always noted in brackets in the listing, as well as a number corresponding to its order in the series.
