HISTORICAL NOTE	Born in England in 1898, Sir Laurence served an apprenticeship with Vickers before joining General Motors in India in 1926. He then worked for General Motors in America, Sweden and England before coming to Australia in 1934. As Managing-Director of General Motors from 1934 to 1947, Sir Laurence was credited with conceiving the first fully-designed and made Australian car. He founded the Melbourne-based Commonwealth Aircraft Corporation in 1935 and was its Director until 1947. Sir Laurence was also Director of Ordinance Production in the Munitions Department for the duration of the second world war as well as establishing Singapore's munitions industry. Sir Laurence Hartnett was a staunch supporter of Australian manufacturing. He died in 1986.
