NOTE ON COLLECTIONS	The letters are addressed to his mother Mrs F J Hawkins at 74 Hawksburn Road, South Yarra and, after March 1916, to Lambert Road, Toorak. The letters from Western Australian are signed very formally H Darrell Hawkins while those from the New Hebrides are signed Bert. Much of the collection was transferred to the Archives in a tin trunk that contained sketches and manuscript drafts of works of fiction. Although the accession of this collection was made in the name of Herbert D. Hawkins, a considerable proportion of the items it contains are the writings of John S. Hawkins and drawings and watercolours signed by N.H. Hawkins, possibly Norman H. Hawkins, Herbert D. Hawkins' father.
