Promoted to Senior Lecturer in 1964, he became Professor in 1967. He was prominent on committees within and outside the University: Chairman of the Royal Botanic Gardens Trust Research Committee; the Maud Gibson (Gardens) Trust, the Rippon Lea Garden Committee (National Trust) and the University of Melbourne Grounds Committee. In 1986 he became the Director of the Royal Botanical Gardens in Sydney and retired in 1996.
