<b>HISTORICAL NOTE</b>	<p>Sir Clive Fitts was born in 1900 and educated at Scotch College, Melbourne Grammar and the University of Melbourne. After graduating M.B. in 1926, Fitts undertook post-graduate work in England, Switzerland and the United States. He subsequently specialized in thoracic medicine and worked as a consulting physician to many of Melbourne's larger hospitals including the Royal Melbourne Hospital and the Royal Women's Hospital. Sir Clive was also a member of the Council of the University of Melbourne &amp; Commonwealth Drug Evaluation Committee, former President of the Friends of the Baillieu Library and former Chairman of the Felton Bequest Committee. He died in February 1984.</p>
