<b>HISTORICAL NOTE</b>	Wilson Hardy commenced distribution of fruit to the gold- fields during the 1850's, expanding to serve other regions of Victoria. From the early 1860's until Hardy's death in 1871, the firm operated from Melbourne's Western Market. Hardy's widow, Mary-Anne nee Tankard daughter of Mathew Tankard, and daughters lived together until the 1930's; his son was a drover in Central Queensland in the 1880's, later working as a miner on the Western Australian Murchison goldfields, where he died of typhoid.

Hardy's widow and daughter lived together until the 1930s; his son was a drover in Central Queensland in the 1880s, later working as a miner on the Western Australian goldfields.
