HISTORICAL NOTE	Disunity and weakness in the non-Labor parties led federal opposition leader R.G. Menzies to call an October 1944 conference, at which 18 organizations were represented [listed in Katharine West's Power in the Liberal Party (1965,p.221,n.33)] - though not the Country Party, which chose to maintain its separate identity. Menzies emphasised the need for an extra-parliamentary organization and an Albury conference of December 1944 set about establishing a framework and drafting a constitution. Public meetings were called to establish grass roots branches; in Victoria these meetings commenced February 1945, and when 130 branches had been formed, a conference of 2 delegates from each met in Melbourne in June. Two notable features of the Victorian organization are provision for equal representation of men and women at all levels, and requirement that at least half of State Executive be members of country branches. First electoral victories were in 1947 in W.A. then in Victoria, and in 1949 the Party began a 23-year term as a federal coalition government. In Victoria it was known as Liberal and Country Party 1949-64.

<u>GENERAL NOTE</u>: The formation of the Liberal Party was set in train in 1942, when it had become increasingly apparent that one of the federal Labor Government's strengths lay in the disunity and consequent weakness of the non-Labor parties. R.G. Menzies, the Leader of the Opposition, convened a conference in Canberra in October 1944, and invited the attendance of those opposed to socialism and the A.L.P. Eighteen political and semi-political organizations (listed in Katharine West's <u>Power in the Liberal Party</u>, Melbourne 1965, p.221, n.33) were represented: the Country Party was not: though invited, it chose to maintain its separate identity. Menzies called for "a true revival of liberal thought", and emphasized that for electoral success "a common organization outside Parliament is absolutely imperative".

A second conference - Albury, December 1944 - applied itself to the establishment of the framework of such an organization, and the drafting of a constitution. Subsequently, a provisional executive committee was formed in each state, and public meetings were called in suburbs and country towns in order to establish the grass roots of the new party, each meeting being invited to form a branch.

In Victoria, these meetings commenced in February 1945; and when 130 branches had been formed a conference of two delegates from each was held in Melbourne (19 June 1945), which constituted the first State Council for Victoria. Two notable features of the Victorian organization are the provision for equal representation of men and women at all levels, and the requirement that at least half of State Executive be members of country branches (until now, the latter provision has been automatically fulfilled through a preponderance of country branches).

The first electoral victory for the Liberal Party was in Western Australia in 1947, but even more dramatically, in November of that year, the party picked up fourteen of the 15 seats lost by the Victorian Labor Government (and within two years was to begin its present long term of office in the federal sphere). State politics in Victoria remained unstable for a few years: in 1949 the Liberal Party siphoned off some membership from the Country Party and renamed itself the Liberal and Country Party, a title it was to retain until the end of 1964; and in 1952-54 a splinter led by T.T. Hollway split off from the main ranks of the parliamentary Liberal and Country Party.

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However, in 1955, under the new leadership of Henry Bolte, the party displaced the Cain Labor Government, and it continues in government at the time of this accession (although Sir Henry Bolte retired from Parliament in August 1972).

Much of the material in this collection related to the election campaigns fought by the Victorian Division of the Liberal Party since its inception not only State Legislative Assembly and Council elections, but also the campaigns for Victorian seats in the House of Representatives and Senate of the Federal Parliament. The principal such elections have been: Victoria - 1945, 1947, 1950, 1952, 1958, 1961, 1964, 1967, and 1970; Federal - 1946, 1949, 1951, 1954, 1955, 1958, 1961, 1963, 1966, and 1969 (plus sundry by-elections and occasional Senate elections held in other years). The material relating to these elections ranges from the pre-selection process in each electorate through to the analysis of results.

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Another major part of the collection relates to the work of committees. In particular, there is a large corpus of documents of the Rural Committee of the Victorian Division, a reflection of the fact that the Liberal Party and its antecedents in Victoria have generally had (or chosen) to operate fairly independently of the state Country Party.
