HISTORICAL NOTE	The A.T.W.U. first obtained Federal registration in July 1918 and its Victorian counterpart was established in the same year. Saw Mill and Timber Yard employees, since the turn of the century have been covered by the Federated Saw Mill and Timber Yard Employees Federation. The new union extended coverage to workers in box and case factories, saw makers' shops, joiners workshops, carpenters, implement workers and wood working machinists. In 1940 the union filed an application and succeeded in extending its coverage to most workers employed in the timber and wood industry including cabinet makers and furniture factories. It amalgamated with the BWIU and eventually became part of the Construction, Forestry, Mining and Energy Union in 1993.

#### HISTORICAL NOTE:

The Australian Timber Workers' Union first obtained federal registration in July 1918. The Victorian Branch was established as the Number 2 branch in February of the same year. Saw Mill and Timber Yard employees, since the turn of the century, had been covered by an association called the Federated Saw Mill and Timber Yard Employees' Association. The new Union extended coverage to persons employed in Box and Case Factories, Saw Makers' Shops, Joiners' Workshops; persons employed preparing timber for Joiners, Carpenters, Implement Makers, Coachbuilders, Car and Wagon Builders, and persons employed as wood working machinists or in connection with hewing, splitting or falling timber. In 1948 the Union filed an application to further extend its coverage to include persons working in or preparing timber for Coopers Workshops, Furniture Factories, Wooden Sporting Goods Factories, Veneer and Plywood Factories. The diverse coverage obtained by this Union split early on into two distinct organising bases in the 'City' and 'Country'. The 'Country' records detail the harsh living and working conditions common at isolated sawmills; both 'City' and 'Country' contain considerable material on the safety aspects of the industry.

NOTE:

Federal Council correspondence for the years 1944 to 1955 is contained within these records and includes considerable material relating to arbitration, awards and agreements.
