The Fraser family lived in NSW before ving to 'Nareen', a sheep station in western Victoria, in 1943. Malcolm Fraser attended Tudor House nool in NSW (1940-1943) and Melbourne Grammar (1944-1948). In 1949 he was admitted to the versity of Oxford to study 'Modern Greats' (politics, philosophy and economics). Malcolm Fraser is elected Liberal member for Wannon in Western Victoria in 1955. He gained his first Cabinet post Minister for the Army in 1966 and later became Minister for Education and Science (1968-1969 and '1-1972) and Minister for Defence (1969-1971). He became leader of the Liberal Party in March '5, and in November was appointed caretaker Prime Minister following the dismissal of the Whitlam remment. He served as Prime Minister until 1983. Following his political career, Malcolm Fraser has intained a role in world affairs, as Co-Chair of the Commonwealth Eminent Persons Group on South ca (1985-1986) and Chair of the UN Secretary-General's Expert Group on African Commodity uses (1989-1990). In 1987 he founded CARE Australia, the country's largest non-political, i-religious overseas aid organisation. In 1997 he led a Commonwealth Observer Mission to Pakistan nonitor the national elections. Malcolm Fraser remained actively interested in issues such as human its and the rule of law until his death on 20 March 2015.

Media statements by the Leader of the Opposition, W G (Bill) Hayden. This series of media statements was accumulated in the Prime Minister's Office during the Prime Ministership of J M (Malcolm) Fraser. The records appear to have been maintained by Mr Fraser's Press Office staff and cover the period of his third Ministry (January to December 1979). The subject coverage is broad and includes economic policy and management; unemployment; petrol prices; manufacturing industry; wage indexation; health services; etc. A transcript of an ABC TV interview by Richard Carleton with Treasurer John Howard and Bill Hayden ('Nationwide', 24 May 1979) is also included in the series. The folders contain copies of press releases and transcripts of interviews; broadcasts and speeches with papers filed in chronological order.
