<b>HISTORICAL NOTE</b>	<p>Wilfrid Russell Grimwade (WRG) was born in Melbourne 15 October 1879 at the Grimwade family home "Harleston". His father, Frederick Sheppard Grimwade (FSG) (1840-1910), travelled to Australia in 1862, arriving early 1863. Soon after FSG's arrival, he married Jessie Taylor Sprunt (1842-1914) and established a partnership as a wholesale druggist with Alfred Felton. WRG was the eighth of nine children and was educated at Melbourne Church of England Grammar School. He graduated from The University of Melbourne in December 1901 with a Bachelor of Science degree (having resided at Ormond College). WRG travelled after his studies and joined the firm of Felton Grimwade and Company in 1903. Throughout his life, WRG was actively involved in the family businesses. [Grimwade family businesses/business interests include Felton Grimwade and Company (1867); Felton, Grimwade &amp; Duerdin Pty Ltd (1929); Drug Houses of Australia (1929); Australian Oxygen Company (1910); Australian Oxygen and Industrial Gases Pty Ltd (1920); Commonwealth Industrial Gases Limited (1935); Carba Dry Ice (1929); and others]. On 12 October 1909 Russell married Mabel Louise Kelly (1887-1973) and in 1910 they purchased "Miegunyah" in which they lived for the duration of their lives. [Grimwade family properties which feature in the collection include family home "Harleston", Caulfield (built 1875, and donated in 1917 to the Melbourne Church of England Grammar School by Wilfrid Russell Grimwade and his three brothers); "Coolart", Grimwade country property on the shores of Western Port (purchased 1895); "Miegunyah", the marital home of Russell and Mab Grimwade, purchased 1910 and located in Orrong Road, Toorak; and "Westerfield", country property of Russell and Mab Grimwade located at Frankston (land purchased in 1920, house built in 1924)]. Interests of Russell (and Mab) Grimwade which feature in the collection include conservation/forestry; timber/woodworking; eucalypts; science; motoring (development of and investigation of fuel alternatives); photography; "Australiana"; discovery/exploration of Australia; Australian history; travel; astronomy (eclipse of the sun); dogs; inventions etc. Publications by WRG include An Anthography of the Eucalypts and Flinders Lane (a biography of Alfred Felton), and numerous articles relating to forestry, science, motoring etc. WRG's philanthropic and community contributions include - the Council of The University of Melbourne; the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute for Medical Research; the National Museum of Victoria; the Felton Bequests committee; Commonwealth Advisory Council of Science and Industry; Botanic Gardens; Australian Forest League; the Melbourne and Victoria Centenary Council and Chairman of its Historical Committee; donor of Captain Cook's Cottage to the people of Victoria in the State's centenary year; donor to the building of the Biochemistry School at The University of Melbourne. WRG was knighted in 1950 for his public and philanthropic activities. Sir Russell Grimwade died 2 November 1955 and Mab lived on at Miegunyah until her death in 1973. Miegunyah and its contents were bequeathed to The University of Melbourne.</p>

<b>NOTE ON COLLECTIONS</b>	<p>The majority of the collection has been created by Russell Grimwade and reflects his achievements and interests; however it is apparent that Mab Grimwade has also made a significant contribution to the collection (resulting in her inclusion in the collection's title). For example series 2 which consists of 'Subject Files' has been established by WRG and contains publications etc of interest to WRG. This filing system has been added to, presumably by Mab, after the death of WRG as several articles/publications post-date 1955. Series 16 contains material which specifically relates to Mab Grimwade.</p> <p><b>Note: Item 19/5 [Town of Melbourne, Harbour of Port Phillip, Australia Felix] was returned to the Ian Potter Museum of Art, University of Melbourne, June 2010</b></p>
