# Joint Parties 4 November 1975 at 10 a.m.

#### Political Situation

Fraser: quick action necessary because of Whitlam's statement that he could govern without supply - meeting of State leaders convened in Melbourne - outcome was to offer to Governor-General - Staff Planning Committee reported firming of attitude in all States - tactics today to expose what devices Government will use to circumvent supply.

<u>Jarman</u>: survey in Deakin over weekend - 161 sample gave good result.

Fraser: only poll which counts is voting intention - W.A. by-election result showed Labor down.

Rae: call for election before July fits with Whitlam's referendum proposal for concurrent elections.

Anderson: not pleased with compromise offer in view of our determination last week and the meeting today - not understand as supply to be passed in April 1976.

Baume: found out through taxi driver.

Fraser: was dependent on meeting with Governor-General and had to announce immediately, or Whitlam's office would distort - Party must accept sudden acts are sometimes necessary - unanimity of State leaders and Shadow Cabinet - accept the point but not always possible to refer to party or contact members.

<u>McMahon</u>: leader must have full authority - leaks creating problems to him and others in working for the party.

Anderson: rung by journalist, asked for comment on Anthony statement,

what all about?

<u>Wright:</u> what action to force decision this week, or next week? - have relevant Acts been examined?

<u>Wood</u>: we allowed Whitlam to take offensive - use Rae's point against Whitlam.

Edwards: must emphasise the basic weakness of the economy throughout.

<u>Jessop</u>: effectiveness of ALP propaganda machine - many Government Departments claiming to have no money - can we check on their funds available?

<u>Cameron</u>: should be advertisements placed stating pensions will not be delayed.

<u>Ian Robinson</u>: strength of our leaders an advantage - stick to our position - should not advertise about pensions - should expose the lies of Ministers.

Anthony: "State of the Nation" comment was run by media as backdown - this is press technique - like CIA nonsense.

#### Tertiary Education Commission Bill

<u>Guilfoyle</u>: amend to protect State Governments balance of certain courses - review effect of amalgamation of 2 Commissions.
