We so many
thanks for sending the
large box & all the things
it contained - I am also
writing a letter of thanks to

you have both been awfully
good to us for I found some
things in the box which I
hadn't the least right to
expect. It is all unpacked
now & we went through it

with the list you sent. I
must say it was beautifully
packed - not one thing was
in any way damaged - Leif
was just as pleased as I was
when he saw all the things.

12.7.11. I began yesterday
but had to leave it. The
things you & Bing sent
have made quite a
difference to the house.
we are very glad to have
them. some of the
pictures are up too. Of

room for this wall paper
kills any small pictures -
The only thing I missed
was a little picture cut
out of a news paper of
"Pretty Polly" the English
race horse. I would be sorry
if it were lost. I like it
so much. If you take
it out of the frame &
post it like a photo, I
have a frame here that will
fit it. George Sheringham's
picture & the little paintings

of Brighton we put in
the diningroom - also
the Talpataiso dagger -
Thank you very much -
from myself & Mr. Poosar -
for the swing chains,
which are useful & extremely
pretty. The Bridge Club
who were here yesterday
admired them very much.
I gave Mr. Poosar his choice
& she took the light one -
which just matched her
dress. I expect she is
writing to you - I like

the dark one just as well
so we were both pleased.
I have been using the
emery already - it is a
thing I so often want - all
my needles were rusty.
I have been having another
look at my sewing chain,
what a lot of work they
must have been. Thank
you for sending on Aunt B.'s
letter. I will write to her
when I am not quite so
busy - Just now there is
plenty of sunshine & I

am getting the winter clothes
cargets, blankets, gloves
etc aired & packed away -
it should have been
done long ago but there
was no dry weather.

Did I tell you what Leif's
people sent us? - A
lovely milk jug - cream
jug I suppose, it is not
large - & sugar basin.
They are silver & very
Norwegian in design.
with a handsome
embossed pattern & both

our initials in one monogram.
I am sure you would
advise them very much -
they are so solid & simple
in design - Alf, the
youngest brother sent a
little tray for them with a
hand painted mat. another
brother, Edward - sent half
a dozen teaspoons in the
same design & Leif's mother
sent an old silver spoon
that he used to eat sugar
out of when he was a
child - it is a very quaint

thing, in the form of a
leaf. With Leif's help I
wrote to them all in
Norwegian - I have some
books to study from. His
father sent them.

you I liked best. I am
getting a frame for it.
