| HISTORICAL NOTE             | Dwayne Campbell was an artist who lived in a shared lesbian household in Brunswick East, an inner urban area of Melbourne.  In 1994, Dwayne was commissioned by Amazon Theatre to design an impressive graphic for the first Amazon Theatre T-shirt. Sheril Berkovitch, the co-founder and editor of <i>Lesbiana</i> , screen printed it onto several purple and black T-shirts which were sold to raise funds for Amazon Theatre's fourth production, <i>Della</i> .  Dwayne had a political interest in protesting against the Gulf wars in the early 1990s as evidenced by the T-shirt and the banner she donated to the VWLLF Archives in 1995, both with the message: Lesbians Say 'No' to the Gulf War, no blood for oil. |
