Leek 27th Feb^y. 1868

I rec^d W. much obliged of the 8th with
the seed for which I am much obliged to you
The frost has had the same effect on the garden
here as with you. The yellow ever-living
was quite melted but hope may spring up, when
I shall send some of it to you & at a proper
season shall send to you shale for some plants
of the Bee-flower.

By this opportunity of Capt. Napier in
the Favorite yacht I have sent you a large
strawberry tree in a basket & a small one
in a crock (which put out of the pot into the
ground & honey ground is best for it) in the
basket is some striped series. Capt. Napier
if the boys at night will lend them or if I come
when I hope you Ketch plenty of Daffs.
I hope my son Jack corresponds with you
from Worthington.
