Sir

I rec'd of Favour of Your Letter & have communicated its Contents to D.^r Le Fevre, who informs me that as soon as he has finish'd giving his Medicine to his present set of Patients he intends to return to Liege & is therefore unable to undertake at present to admit any more Patients than those already under his Care. The Doctor proposes as soon as he has administered his Course of Medicine to those to whom he is engag'd at Liege to return again to England & this he supposes may be about 7 Month of January or February next when he shall be gl'd of y^e Honour of any Gentlemen who will entrust themselves to his Care & has engag'd to give my Father y^e earliest Intelligence of his Arrival in London for y^e purpose of communicating it to any Friends of his who may be so dispos'd. My Father sends You his best Compliments & heartily wishes it was in his power to render You any Comfort or Assistance under Your unhappy Condition, he will finish his second Course of Medicine y^e Beginning of next Week & returns home soon after when he proposes to call upon You

& will then give You any other more particular Information
on this Head. I am
