Robt at 9th of Nov^r 1798

Early on Tuesday morning I got to Doctor Sted's house and had the good fortune
to meet with him in good. I had almost two hours talk with him and told him a
natural of Miss Merslem's fits in a very particular manner he says he has seen
sore, that what she has taken has had no effect upon her and if her fits are
to be cured by any man living he can cure them but she being so far distant from
him he cannot tell what remedies to use so well as if he was daily to see her, her
fits being Epileptick and is caused by a stagnation in the Animal spirits
He wishes you could prevail with one Mad^m Yonge a very Motherly Gentleman
that lives by him to let Miss be there he would take more care of her than
he does of his own soul and hopes by Gods assistance to make a cure of
her: he has the applause of all people I have conversed with and am informed
not by him self only but by many others that he has cured two or three
people with fits within this two months I have ordered him to get ready
what Medicines he thinks proper against Saturday. If you have any
thought of Miss being at Mad^m Yonge's please to write me word of return
of the post and if you think proper I'll mention the thing to her. I find
she is a very good sort of a Gentlewoman: the Doctor says her being at the
Bolling is equal as being at Bristol: and if she is ^{at Mad^m Yonge's} she
will daily attend her and then shall know what Medicines to make
use of according to her Constitution and state of health
I have made all the Enquiries I can Relating to the Price and Quantity
of Sider there is not one Person in ten but will tell you that there is
no new Sider made of any one sort of fruit in the County I am Informed
that New Sider will be from 2s to 4s. The Mr Antony Rismour tells
me Mr Stratford will not make any. He will Endeavour to speak with
Mr Woolle & Mr. Tanner &c upon Thursday I have not to add at
present. That paper is very scarce in Herefordshire and wish you may
Read this Writings with Mr Humble & send to Mad^m Miss and all the family
and accept the same as help from a Mr Your Humble Servant
