Dear Sir

Worcester 25 July 1771

I have shown my mother Mrs
Mattocks Letter she seem very well
pleas'd with the thought of being to move
from where she is but wishes she ad
never left Flap Gate, I thank god I am
much better then when you left me &
hope to be at home in three weeks.
from this dat at farthist & mother will
me so beg that you will write to Mrs
Mattocks according as she desires to be
at home a fortnight before ^{my} Mother Coms -
I have been at Colwall twice & have
at last packt up what I thought best to
Com to Bristol in 2 Hoggards a Trunk
& am of drams deyrhted for Mr Bush
it is to be sent to Upton upon Monday -
now if you thinks it best for Mother
to go to Mrs Mattocks imedeately you -
must order her a bedsid for her &
a mess bedsid for her maid unless
you can spare your Lette bedsid then

the maids may be omitted there are to fetch Beds
in one of the hogsheds the Blen fennetted
for the Bed is in the great Chest which
may be ad out before I come home if it
is wanting it is left at the Top ~~which~~
for Conduancey as there is things in that
will break beg the person that takes it out
will be Carefull - ~~then~~ the Repores at
wellon goes on very well / at the Comins
but slow but have promist that will get
more hands next week observe what
you say about the boards which Thoms
will do the redfull - I find by your Being
in the mortar what a Resolution you have
fixt which I hartley wish you health to go-
thron nith - I am glad to hear that
mr meyer is so well my Daughter loves me
in Com to mr meyer mr A Wright Mr I More
& self & belive me to be
your Ever affth Sister

Let our family know
that I am well & will
write to them upon Tuesday 5th 98
