SHIPPED by the Grace of God, in good Order and well Condition'd, by
Bright & Duncomb and Leaman
in and upon the good Ship called the *Severn*
whereof is Master, under God, for this present Voyage, *James Henderson*
and now riding at Anchor in the *Anatto Bay*
and by God's Grace bound for *Bristol* to say
four Hogsheds Sugar on account and risque of Henry
Bright Esquire

being marked and numbered as in the Margin, and are to be delivered in the like good
Order, and well Condition'd, at the aforesaid Port of *Bristol* the Danger
of the Seas only excepted) unto *Henry Bright Esq^r*

or to his Assigns, he or they paying Freight for the said Goods *five Shillings*
per hundred weight at the Kings Beam

with Primage and Average accustomed. In witness whereof the Master or Purser of
the said Ship hath affirmed to *three* Bills of Lading, all of this Tenor and Date; the
one of which *three* Bills being accomplished, the other *two* to stand void. And so
God send the good Ship to her desired Port in Safety. AMEN, Dated in *Kingston*
Jamaica the day of July 1777
