We return you our hearty thanks for your kindness to my dear spouse, who thro' the kind providence of God is arrived safe home Yesterday in the afternoon - My Wife has done ye better she could with Sister Lubbock and gave five pounds on your account, and one pound six sent to her from Bristol - She promised to take care to get a living - She owes three Pounds for Rent, so that she shall have but a little to begin with. She expected 20 or 30<sup>l</sup>. My Wife desired her to make good use of this she had now - We shall be glad to hear how sister is, for she was something indisposed when your sister came away. How Cousin Sally and Cousin Richard are - We heartily wish you all well in the Lord & conclude with our unfained Love to your whole Family from your loving Brother - G. Rudd -
