Elizabeth Evans to Rich^d. Maylor

Philadelphia March 26th 1738⁹

Dear Brother,

These with my kind love to you
return you hearty thanks for your kind present
of Capt. Bond & so soon as in my power will endeavor
to make you amends. My husband was
shipt for Barbadoes, but the Boom breaking disabled
almost every hand, himself especially; so
that he was prevented going that voyage, but
since is better and is shipt for Antigua, looks
every hour to sail. My daughter Mary dyed
last Xmas. My son is married in Barbadoes.
Mary left her only child living under my care,
which is costly. Dear Brother, it is almost a
sin to put upon good nature, & thereby abate
civility. But if you please to continue yo^r.

brotherly love, I can only beg and pray that the
Allmighty God may by his blessing restore it to
you tenfold; and so with mine & my husband's
kind love to yo^r yo^r spouse & daughter and all
my Brothers, sisters, relations, & all friends where-
ever

ever that I am in bodily health -
