By reference to the Books of the Royal Institution, it was found that
the Payment of admission fee, & year subscription, was paid ⁱⁿ Feb. 1818.
- Many years subsequent to the Debt: having been presented to Banwell,
and the discrepancy of this entry, with the payment on the 19th of 1818
/month, created a difficulty which required some further investigation.
