GENERAL NOTE:

Established about October 1906, and registered March 1907, the membership of this union has remained small, concentrated in wide and disparate areas of grocery manufacture, both food products and domestic stores. The union changed its name to its present title in 1914, and assumed a federated character, with branches in Victoria and South Australia. An attempt to establish a branch in N.S.W. during the 1920's failed, due to A.W.U. opposition.

For many years both the Victorian and Federal secretary was F.J. Riley, a notable figure in the Victorian labour movement, and the collection provides valuable records of his career; while other material, notably the "Conference Minutes" provide all-too-rare examples of the day-to-day job negotiations that are the rationale of union organization.
