Quotes in scope and content to be encased in "double quote marks". As in: "Because nobody else is going to. Primitive man feared the vagina..."

I have added in my terms, highlighted in the pretty green/blue. Banks and banking used for many financial records, include cheque book stubs, motor vehicle driving (lame) but used that for her efforts to learn to drive, squatters (Westbourne Grove debacle 1973) and painters felt like a useful distinction to the broader category of women artists.

## Subject headings: style notes and things to consider (28 July meeting)

**How does search work:** This is a major point! Lachlan to follow up on how Greer Archive can be searched once on Emu (and D-Space). Can researchers keyword search across the entire archive? Or will they need to go into separate series? Audio: how will that work? Will researchers have to open up each time-coded summary to search keywords? [RB or Kate to ask Millie about how NLA oral history records and collections can be searched]

**Basic style:** use 's' not 'z' in words like fertilisation

**Upper and lower case:** Upper case; Then again; And again; As per Lib Congress headings. No need to go back and change, just do it like this from now on.

**Standard language:** newspaper cuttings are press clippings. Unpublished (articles, essays); unrealised (film scripts, TV docos, plays etc). We discussed LC forms classification and Powerhouse formats guide. Can explore further if we think required.

**LC extensions:** Calabria (Italy); feminism – Sweden.

**Cultural relativism:** discussion of this term to describe a common argument in Greer work on India, Sudan, China, Ethiopia and elsewhere. No agreement reached. Not a term Greer would use but one that researchers might. Is this going too far in interpreting record? Cultural imperialism a similar, perhaps problematic, but useful term.

**Eric Greer:** Agreed to use Eric (Reg) Greer.

**Religion:** Catholics, Catholic Church. LG to add Madonna and child as non standard term.

**Birth control:** discussion. Contraception. Other terms: oral contraception; coitus interruptus. Family planning linked with 'natural family planning' (rhythm method) RB. Need a term, perhaps, to describe population control?

**Copy editing:** useful to describe arguments with editors. LG using English language – useage. Publishers and publishing/authors and publishers.

**Gender:** Transgender people one solid term; gender identity another one to encompass broader arguments about gender. RB raised terms she has used to describe sex change surgery (reassignment, sex; sex change; sexual dimorphism in humans).

Ebsco Publishing's LGBT Life database (Sue Fairbanks is following up with library)

### Other things:

**Cross referencing:** Where possible indicate item number for relevant records in other series (eg Primo Levi print item cross-references Primo Levi audio record).

**Audio topics and themes:** Kate to write a brief summary once a week about what she's been listening to so we can match it up with paper records.

**Notes mode:** a space for noting conservation and sensitive material but also notes to self on connections to follow up, interesting stuff. We are all doing this.

**Diversity of style:** LG noted we are all working with different types of records so there will be some differences in approach, especially in scope and content notes. Discussion of uses of Greer inventory listings. RB using them, often verbatim, for part of print scope and content. Less useful for SB in major works – her approach is a descriptive few sentences and a more truncated list of subject headings. LG is using subjects, correspondents and judicious descriptive sentences when there is a tranche of letters that is particularly substantial or noteworthy. KH is using natural language in keywords of summary but subject headings in scope and content.
