HISTORICAL NOTE

John Gordon Morrison (1904 - 1998)

John Morrison was born in Sunderland, England on the 29th January, 1904. In 1923, aged nineteen, he migrated to Australia. First finding work on a sheep station in N.S.W., he eventually settled in Melbourne, marrying his first wife, Frances, in 1928 and working for the next ten years as a wharfie on the waterfront. During this time his socialist convictions strengthened, leading him to join the Australian Communist Party.

Along with other notable left wing writers (including Alan Marshall and Judah Waten) Morrison became a member of the Melbourne Realist Writers' Group. By the mid-1950's he had published two collections of short stories (Sailors Belong Ships, 1947; Black Cargo, 1955) and two novels (The Creeping City, 1949; Port of Call, 1950). Having moved to the Dandenongs, a place he loved and which became the setting for The Creeping City, he began working as a gardener - an occupation in which he remained for the rest of his working life.

In 1969, after the death of his first wife, Frances, Morrison married Rachel, a Polish immigrant. While he remained active in the literary scene of the 1960s & 1970s - primarily through his newspaper reviews and his travels to the Soviet Union as a delegate of the Fellowship of Australian Writers - these decades were, in terms of books, lean times for Morrison, with only three volumes of his work being published (<u>Twenty-Three</u>, 1962; <u>Selected Stories</u>, 1972; and Australian By Choice, 1973).

It wasn't until the 1980s, when Morrison himself was in his eighties, that his literary output received more widespread attention. During this period many of his earlier short stories were reissued in collections published by Penguin (North Wind, 1982; Stories of the Waterfront, 1984; This Freedom, 1985; and The Best Stories of John Morrison, 1988). In addition to these, a book of essays and memoirs, The Happy Warrior, was published by Pascoe Publishing in 1988. While Morrison's contribution to Australian literature had been previously recognised in his being awarded the Gold Medal of the Australian Literature Society for Twenty-Three in 1963, and his being granted an Emeritus Fellowship by the Australia Council, it was his winning of the Patrick White Literary Award in 1986 which brought him the greatest acclaim. A further accolade was bestowed upon him in 1989 when he was awarded the Australia Medal for services to literature. John Morrison died in 1998.

THE COLLECTION

This collection of John Morrison's personal papers, concentrating as it does on the years between 1980 and 1994, provides the researcher with a fascinating view of the twilight years of a writer's life.

The correspondence, which forms the bulk of the collection, reveals both the celebration surrounding Morrison's late-in-life success, and his frustration at no longer being physically able to write. Many of the letters deal with the day-to-day negotiations between publishers and an author, while others, like the long series of letters from David Martin (see 1/1/51b), allow us to eavesdrop on at least one side of a conversation between two prominent Australian authors.

The collection of other people's reviews of Morrison's books enables the researcher to gauge how his work was received at the time of its publication. Similarly, the book reviews written by Morrison act as a reliable record of his various literary tastes and opinions.
